Indivisible NOCO 2025 Voting Recommendation for City Council District 3

Indivisible NOCO recommends ranking Amy Hoeven first and Zoelle Lane second in the upcoming Fort Collins City Council election. Both candidates reflect the progressive values we champion but differ in their experience and command of the full range of issues facing our city.

Amy Hoeven stands out for her coalition-building work on behalf of students, immigrants, and other underrepresented groups. Her responses to our questions on housing affordability, transportation, downtown parking, and small business development were decisive, well-researched, and grounded in practical solutions. She demonstrated a clear understanding of competing priorities and offered thoughtful strategies for moving Fort Collins forward.

Zoelle Lane brings an important lived perspective to the housing affordability crisis. As a young professional working full-time at the University, she faces the real possibility of being priced out of the city she serves. Her advocacy for unionizing City workers is strong and principled. However, our decision to rank her second stems from two concerns: her housing policy proposals did not fully account for the diverse needs of Fort Collins residents, and she showed limited familiarity with issues beyond housing and labor. That said, we believe Ms. Lane is smart, passionate, and capable of quickly expanding her policy fluency.

Regardless of the election outcome, we urge City Council to elevate voices like Ms. Lane's in shaping housing policy. Fort Collins must find a way for those who work here to afford to live here.
